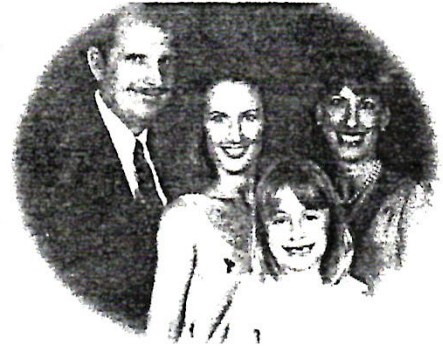

Haiti, Jamaica and Belize

The Warren's took a leap of faith in the year 2000 and entered the ministry as full-time missionaries. Don Warren is the Area Director for Haiti, Jamaica and Belize with Evangelism Explosion. They are having many adventures as they serve the Lord in ministry together. Don and Suzy have traveled to Haiti and Albania. At the close of 2000, they will be traveling to Italy and Eastern Europe to do site preparation for the upcoming 2001 summer Youth EE Clinics to be held in many different locations around Europe. Although they are not certain of what country they will be in to celebrate the birth of their Lord Jesus Christ, they will be together with their two daughters for Christmas.

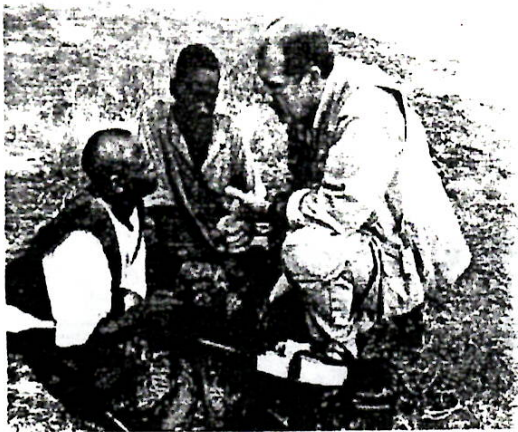
There was much rejoicing at what God is doing in Haiti as Nationals take ownership of their EE ministry. It was the first time all of the representatives from the 200 EE churches had ever gotten together.



Christian, is a father with six children in Belize. He had a debilitating stoke 2 years ago that left his speech impaired and his left side partially paralyzed. Even though he struggles to feed his family, he is active in his local church as a deacon and thanked Don for coming and sharing the EE training with him at his church.

Southern Sudan

Don traveled to Southern Sudan in November to help equip the pastors and chaplains through the ministry of EE. 93 participated in two Adult and two KIDS-EE Clinics in two areas, that taught them to share their faith with others. With first hand experience, Don and the others on the team felt the terror of what the Sudanese people face daily as eight bombs dropped on them as they conducted a Sunday morning worship service at the church, a civilian and non-military target. Five bombs were dropped on the first pass of the Russian Antonov aircraft and three more on the second pass. The bomb shelter was a mere pit dug in the ground, only as deep as their knees. They stood in the pit, trying to crouch down while they saw God supernaturally intervene to spare their lives. The last bomb dropped only 17 yards from them. Miraculously, the 500 pound bomb casing didn't explode shrapnel out, but blew into the air, leaving the casing intact. No harm came to the 250 people or the church building from the flying shrapnel. God allowed the team to return home to tell what the persecuted church experiencing.

Fifteen-year-old Bullen is the leader of the children in this village, many orphaned by the war. Bullen had the children collect a gift of six eggs for Don to thank him for coming and sharing. Don gave him \$2.00, and instead of keeping it for himself, he bought milk for the other children, dividing it into their tin cups. This was the first milk they'd had this year.



This commander told Don, "we used to think our power was in our guns, but we know now that our power is in our *God*."



Don teaches the pastors and chaplains KIDS-EE. For those whose English reading and writing skills were not sufficient to participate in the Adult Clinics, they were taught KIDS-EE with interpreters. Six different languages were translated as they learned to share their faith in a simple way.

KIDS EE

Don's passion for sharing the gospel through the ministry of Evangelism Explosion has taken on a new dimension as he teaches children and adults KIDS EE. This is an equipping ministry that helps adults learn to share the gospel with children and helps children learn about the gospel, clarify their faith, and trains them to share with other.

Indonesia

Don helped teach the first KIDS EE Clinic in Jakarta, Indonesia in May. Four of those participating in the clinic saw their churches burn to the ground by radical Muslims this year, one of which was a 2,000-seat church in downtown Jakarta. One clinician said, "the Muslims think when they burn our buildings that they are really destroying the church, but the church is the believers who are the members. This is actually strengthening our faith in God and His sovereign power."

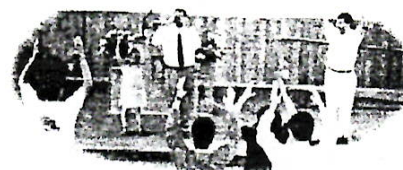


There have been over 1,000 churches burned down in the last ten years in Indonesia. Half of those in the last two years. One of the clinicians from the island of Lombok had seen all 20 churches on this island burned down on the same day, January 17, 2000.

She said that they know they could lose their lives to the Muslims at any time, but they were at peace, because they weren't home yet and God is sovereign. BUT, their children were scared. They were so grateful for this team that had come to teach them a way to share their Christian faith with their children, so that they could experience this same peace in the face of death.



Washington and Michigan



This summer, Don, Suzy, and Braman traveled to Washington and Michigan states, where they visited family and friends. The Warren's shared with two Chinese churches, one in Seattle, Washington and one in Ann Arbor, Michigan.
