

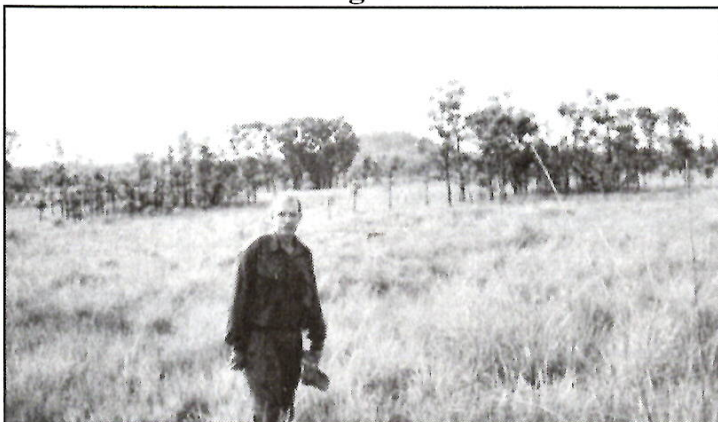

Lives will be changed as solar powered fixed-station radios will be distributed to thousands in this area, as you help, allowing the Good News to be proclaimed in these nations.

On The Road Again

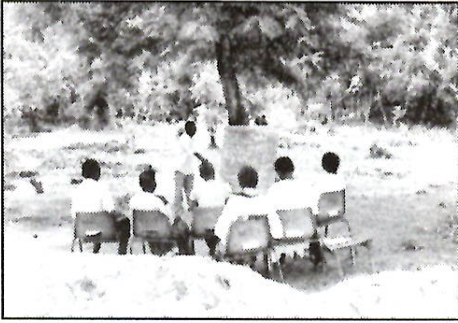
Don returned to Southern Sudan this spring to access the progress of the building projects he had organized last fall. Two days before he flew into Yambio, Southern Sudan, the LRA, (a group of terrorists, funded by the radical Muslims) had raided this town of mud-huts where 200,000 people live. Don had arranged for a truck to drive from Yambio to Ezo, but arrived to find that the truck had been burned and destroyed, a casualty of the LRA raid. Undaunted, he bought a motorbike to make the dangerous 105 mile trek to Ezo. This was the same road the LRA was on, retreating back to the DR Congo where they are currently located. He was praying that the LRA was a couple of days ahead of him. The trip took 9 hours over muddy, slippery roads. Sometimes Don was straddling potholes, trying to keep the bike upright as he dodged snakes as they dropped from the trees. Sometimes there was as much as six inches of rotting mangoes on the road. He had never ridden a motorbike before, and half-way to Ezo, he said if he never rode a bike again, it would be okay. Of course the problem was that he had to return over the same road to catch his plane to return home.



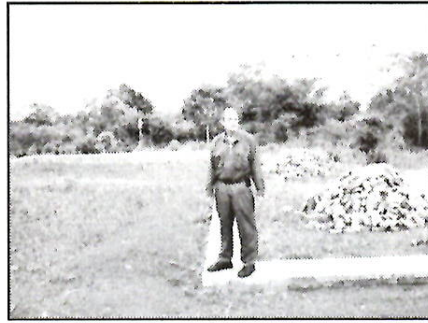
Rejoice Still Rejoices

Her name is Rejoice. She is a graduate from the Yambio Seminary where KIDS EE has been taught. When the LRA raided Yambio just before Don's arrival there, Rejoice was captured. She was tied to other young women and girls. They were loaded down with the supplies the LRA had stolen from her town. These young women were beat and brutalized as they were used as "mules" to carry out the stolen goods. They were brutally marched over 150 miles into the DR Congo with little food and water. Rejoice was left for dead on the trail. Others from her village found her and carried her back to Yambio. When Don spoke to her, she weakly told him that she will still rejoice because she knows who she serves. She thanked God that her life had been spared so she could continue to tell others about Jesus and her overwhelming love for Him.

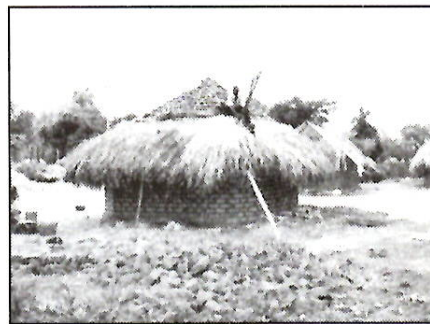

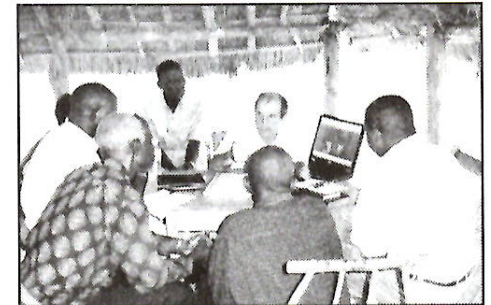

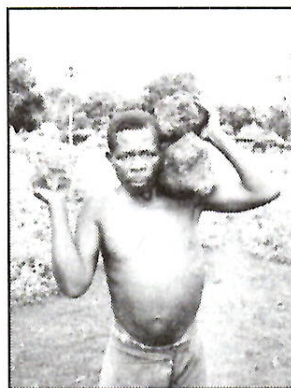
Student housing being constructed at the Centers.
